Classes for 2018

Our classes and staffing each year depends on the number of students enrolled. We currently have around 310 students which will mean no changes to our overall structure and organization. The organisation of classes is a process which is carefully planned.

In the coming weeks, the school will begin planning for classes in 2018. In this process, teachers, school executive and the Learning Support Team, use professional judgement to very carefully ensure the correct placement of students in classes for next year. Occasionally, parents or carers have a specific concern for the wellbeing of their child for consideration in this process. If you have a specific concern, it is important to, firstly, share your concern with the child's class teacher – as they may have a different perspective to add. Having done that, concerns can be put in writing to the attention of the school principal and submitted to the office.

Concerns or requests pertaining to the child's social, academic or emotional wellbeing will be carefully considered within the process. Under the principle of equity, requests for specific classroom teachers for 2018 will not be considered.

Prefects Elections

Prefects speeches will be held on Tuesday November 28th at 9.45am in the Hall. Parents are welcome to attend.

Student leaders play a very important role in a school. They lead by example in class and in the playground and provide stability in the organization of the many school events that students engage in.

The criteria for potential student leaders in our school includes the following examples:

- Demonstrates exemplary behaviour and respect for the school and the people in it
- Acts with honesty, integrity and respect at all times
- Demonstrates positive school spirit at all times
- Displays initiative and willingness to participate
- Demonstrates pride in our school through behaviour, attitude and wearing of school uniform
- Is able to communicate effectively with students and teachers
- Gives full effort to all areas of academic, sporting and cultural endeavours
- Displays friendliness and charity towards fellow students at all times

- Possesses a genuine desire to help improve the school and the environment
- Possesses a satisfactory discipline record at school

Year 5 students will nominate for prefect in Term 4 of each year.

The students are permitted to post 2 x A4 size posters on the school walls or windows, detailing their virtues as a potential prefect.

A date will be set aside for each nominee to address the students from Year 2 to Year 6 for 1 - 2 minutes, detailing how they believe they will be worthy school leaders.

The students will then vote for 10 prefects. The votes will be tallied and the first ranked boy and girl shall be named school captains. The next ranked eight students of either gender shall be named prefects.

The successful group of 10 will be announced immediately but the announcement of school captains and the pinning on of badges takes place at Presentation Day.






