




In Science we have been exploring the topic Forces and have enjoyed investigating non-contact and contact forces. We experimented by making balloon thrusted cars, balloon rockets, along with observing the movement of magnetic forces using iron filings, paperclips and magnets.



During our Maths sessions we have consolidated our learning of Angles using technology and made self to world connections through our investigations. Students were able to use the ipad applications 'Padlet' and take photos of different types of angles found in our classroom and around our playground. Students then edited the photo to identify the type of angles they had found. Accessing Padlet using a QR code students then uploaded each picture into its correct category of acute, right, obtuse, straight, reflex or revolution.

Rules #7 MOBILE PHONE USE

WHIST DRIVING

Only fully licensed drivers may make or receive audio calls on a mobile phone whilst driving if it is secured in a commercially designed mount fixed to the vehicle or being used hands-free. Holders of all other license types are not permitted to use a mobile phone whilst driving. Children and young people are extremely vulnerable in the road environment. They need you to take extra care when driving and parking around schools. Penalties are greater for breaking the road rules in a school zone.
