Last week, Year 6 students travelled to Canberra, Jindabyne and Thredbo. We had an amazing time exploring and taking in the sights!

On Day One, we travelled to Australia's Capital beginning with a tour of "Deadly Defining Moments" to learn about First Nation's People and we even got to see Pharlap's heart! After this we walked around the beautiful gardens and miniature world of Cockington Green, including a train ride. The highlight of the day was delving into the world of science at Questacon where we

experienced an earthquake simulator and a free fall slide.

Day Two was also jam packed with fun experiences including a visit to the playground at Canberra's Arboretum. We then had a tour of the Royal Australian Mint to see how coins are made. At Parliament House, students met our member for Calare, Andrew Gee and watched Parliament in action.
