SCHOOL LEADERSHIP 2024



APPLICATION FOR YEAR 7 SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT IN 2025

Selective high schools provide a learning environment designed for academically gifted and high potential students. There are 47 selective high schools for Year 7 entry each year, including an online class, Aurora College, for rural and remote students. Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2025 open on 9 November October 2023 and close on 20 2023 our https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-andopportunity-classes/year-7. During our most recent P&C meeting, the question was raised as to the purpose of the P&C within a school. This would seem a suitable time to outline some of the reasons for a P&C and the processes, roles and responsibilities.

Kids only get one shot at a childhood, and we all must work together to help them reach their full potential.

Why have a P&C **Association?**

A P&C Association enables parents and citizens to meet to determine the needs and aspirations of the school community. The Education Act 1990 ensures that a $\mbox{P\&C}$ Association may be established at any government school.

The objects of a P&C Association are to; promote the interests of the school by bringing parents, citizens, pupils and teaching staff into close co-operation; assist in providing equipment required by the school, assist the teaching staff in establishment of school policy and management in all facets of school activities.

P&C

Membership of P&C associations is open to all members of the school Who can join the community: parents, teachers and citizens.

Does the P&C make money?

- One of the aims of a P&C Association is to advance education, this is considered a charitable purpose and therefore a non profit organisation. The objectives of your P&C Association focus on the improvement and provision of services to others, particularly children in public
- The P&C Association can keep profits as long as there is a genuine reason and it is to do with its purpose. For example, a good reason to keep profits may be, to save up for a new project, funding a specific item or accumulating a reserve so it continues to be sustainable.
- No P&C member or officer may receive any remuneration or other material benefit by reason of their position in the P&C Association

The role of the School Principal in the P&C

- The Principal is automatically a member of the P&C Association because they are the school's
- The Principal is entitled to vote and to move and second motions at a meeting and engage in 2
- As an ex-officio member the Principal cannot stand for election to an office bearer position. 3
- The Principal cannot be a signatory to a P&C bank account.
- The Principal's role in a P&C meeting is to table a written report to each meeting, respond to questions arising and offer advice on the Department of Education guidelines. The Principal does not have a right of veto or the right to gag P&C Association or sub-committee discussions. However, it is incumbent on the principal to highlight disparities between P&C Association/sub-committee discussions and Department of Education policy.

Some benefits of joining the P&C

- Connect people within the school community.
- Promote shared learning goals and collaboration.
- Increase learning opportunities for students.
- ·Support personalised student learning journeys.
- · Create an inclusive learning community.
- Encourage shared responsibility.

How many people does it take to have a P&C?

Where the association has a current membership of less than 50, the quorum shall be set according to the rules of the association but shall not be less than

If after 15 minutes of the advertised start time you do not have quorum then you cannot meet.

How often does the P&C meet?

Association?

Typically on a monthly basis at the school, holidays excluded. Meetings typically last 45 minutes.


